"Or do you not know, brethren (for I speak to those who know the law), that the law has dominion over a man as long as he lives? For the woman who has a husband is bound by the law to her husband as long as he lives. But if the husband dies, she is released from the law of her husband. ..." (Romans 7:1-3; NKJ)

For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision avails anything, but faith working through love. ... And I, brethren, if I still preach circumcision, why do I still suffer persecution? Then the offense of the cross has ceased. I could wish that those who trouble you would even cut themselves off!" (Galatian 5:1-2; 6, 11-12)
